Morty - Effervescent older actor who is very impressed with himself

Jessica – New girl, young theater actress doing her first radio show

## **START**

(MORTY and JESSICA shake hands. LAUREN crosses up to the piano and looks over sheet music.)

MORTY. Nice to know you, kiddo.

JESSICA. Morty Sparks? Thee...Morty Sparks?

MORTY. Such a sweet child.

JESSICA. You were in Sergeant York with Gary Cooper!

MORTY. A little known fact, but true.

JESSICA. You were in the Jupiter Radio Theatre.

MORTY. You've done your homework.

JESSICA. Winston Sayles and the Jupiter Radio Theatre. I'll never forget Winston Sayles in Battle of the Planets. He's so dreamy.

MORTY. Well...maybe he was. He's let himself go these past few years...

JESSICA. He was in the first Broadway show I did two years ago. Gosh, I'm still in love with him.

MORTY. Yeah, it's too bad what a couple of years of aging can do to a guy...

JESSICA. (Looking around the studio:) This is my first job in radio but I just love Radio Suspense Theatre. So, this is where it all happens. Were you here when Winston Sayles was a guest star for The Hitch Hiker?

MORTY. The Hitch Hiker? Yeah, I was in that, you don't remember me?

JESSICA. What part did you play?

(LOIS LANGE and GRACIE WILSON enter.)

(MORTY notices their entrance then turns quickly to JESSICA so as to be overheard.)

MORTY. Yes, young lady. It's always nice to run into a fan of mine. Just stick with me and I'll show you the ropes. Gary? Yeah, Gary and I go back a long way. I remember once, "Coop," I said. "Coop..."

(MORTY turns and pretends to see LOIS and GRACIE for the first time.)

Oh, Hi, girls.

(He crosses to them, pointing to JESSICA.)

New kid. Turns out she happens to be a fan of mine. I guess if you're in radio long enough you start working with your fans.
